

**STATEWIDE ARTICULATION AGREEMENT
BETWEEN
MORGAN STATE UNIVERSITY
AND
MARYLAND STATE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION
ON BEHALF OF LOCAL SCHOOL SYSTEMS**

This articulation agreement can be used for students enrolling in the following programs:

*Undergraduate program in Construction Management
Undergraduate program in Architecture & Environmental Design
at the School of Architecture & Planning
in Morgan State University*

Maryland State Department of Education (MSDE) and Morgan State University (MSU) enter into this articulation agreement in order to facilitate the enrollment of students into MSU from the Maryland Career and Technology Education (CTE) Programs of Study in Construction Design and Management (CDM), CIP 15.1350, and Pre-engineering Project Lead The Way, Civil Engineering and Architecture pathway (PLTW-CEA), CIP 15.5000.

The purpose of this document is to outline responsibilities for ensuring that students earn college credit for the MSDE CTE CDM and PLTW Programs of Study. MSDE, MSU, and participating local school systems and students, share responsibilities for adherence to this agreement.

Subject to terms of this agreement,

- a student who successfully completes the approved CDM Maryland CTE Program of Study, and who enrolls at MSU, will be granted advanced credit at Morgan State University for *either* (a) CMGT 241, Introduction to Construction Management (3 credits) in the undergraduate program in Construction Management; or (b) ARCH 103, Communication Skills I (3 credits) in the undergraduate program in Architecture & Environmental Design.

OR

- a student who successfully completes an approved PLTW-CEA Maryland CTE Program of Study, and who enrolls at MSU, will be granted advanced credit at Morgan State University for ARCH 103, Communication Skills I (3 credits) in the undergraduate program in Architecture & Environmental Design.

All eligible students will have completed either the Maryland Career and Technology Education approved Program of Study in Construction Design and Management or Pre-engineering Project Lead The Way, CEA pathway.

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THE TERMS OF THIS AGREEMENT ARE AS FOLLOWS:

Maryland Local School Systems will:

- Offer the Maryland Career and Technology Education (CTE) Program of Study in Construction Design and Management or Pre-engineering Project Lead The Way (Civil Engineering and Architecture pathway);
- Communicate details of this agreement to principals, teaching staff, guidance personnel, students and parents and/or guardians; and
- Provide proof of successful completion of the Maryland CTE Construction Design and Management or Pre-engineering Project Lead The Way, (Civil Engineering and Architecture pathway) Programs of Study to the individual student, and upon request, to Morgan State University.

Students will:

- Complete the entire Maryland CTE Construction Design and Management or Pre-engineering Project Lead The Way (Civil Engineering and Architecture pathway) Programs of Study by taking all required courses as designated in the Pathway Options;
- Receive a Maryland high school diploma;
- Meet the admission dates, procedures, and requirements that apply to all new students at Morgan State University;
- Meet current university policies on Advanced Credit;
- Earn a 'C' or better in their applicable Maryland CTE program of study;
- Complete and submit to MSU a Transfer Credit Evaluation Request Form; and
- Attach to the Transfer Credit Evaluation Form proof of successful completion of the Maryland CTE Construction Design and Management or Pre-engineering Project Lead The Way (Civil Engineering and Architecture pathway) Programs of Study to Morgan State University.

Morgan State University will:

- Arrange meetings, as requested, with interested high school faculty and students on the Morgan State University undergraduate programs in Construction Management or Architecture & Environmental Design, and provide interested students with application and articulation assistance;
- Supply MSDE and local school systems with promotional literature that will be used to assist students with the application and/or articulation process;
- Communicate details of this agreement to MSU faculty, and staff in admissions and academic affairs;
- Award the appropriate number of academic credits, as specified in this agreement, upon review of the student's transcript and completion of the admissions and application process;
- Notify student of credits awarded; and
- Provide to MSDE each spring an updated list of high school student credits earned.

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Maryland State Department of Education will:

- Communicate details of this agreement with local school systems via CTE Directors;
- Confirm programs participating in the articulation agreement are currently complying with the requirements of the Maryland Department of Education, Career and Technology, Construction Design and Management, and Pre-engineering Project Lead The Way (Civil Engineering and Architecture pathway), Programs of Study as described in Attachment A;
- Annually provide Morgan State University with a list of secondary schools offering the approved Maryland CTE Programs of Study in Construction Design and Management, and Pre-engineering Project Lead The Way; and
- Annually provide Morgan State University with a list of CTE Directors.

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THE UNDERSIGNED AGREE to uphold all requirements of this agreement, including:


- that this Agreement renews automatically until determined otherwise in writing by either party,
- to immediately notify the other party of any changes made to the aforementioned MSDE programs or MSU courses,
- that this Agreement may be modified by mutual written consent at any time, and
- if the agreement is terminated, all student credits previously awarded will remain unaffected.
